## **Corella Management Program**

A management program to trap, and remove Butler's Corella's, a declared pest in the wheatbelt, will commence in Merredin this month.

The current large local population is causing significant environmental destruction, long-term damage to important habitats for other species such as the endangered black cockatoo, and significant damage to our playing surfaces, native vegetation and infrastructure.

The Shire of Merredin's management will include a multi-pronged humane approach, as part of a regional natural resource management program.



## **CBD Project Update — Pioneer Park**

Construction of Stage 1 of the CBD Project Pioneer Park kicked off in April, with the creation of a new carpark. With the kerbing already in place, asphalting this month will see completion of the car park swinging off Great Eastern Highway between the Military and Railway museums.



This aspect of the project is expected to be a great opportunity to show off our outstanding local Railway and Military museums with better and safer access.

Rob Endersbee, the enthusiastic owner and curator of the Military Museum, says he is pleased to see the progress on the carpark and upgrade of Pioneer Park. With over 200 visitors a month, the new carpark will make it much safer for visitors to visit the museum and not have to reverse out on to a busy highway.

The Railway Museum also tells an important story of local history and buildings. Its Chairperson Jane Patroni says it's exciting to see the development moving ahead and that they are awaiting the completion of Pioneer park with interest.

Other aspects of Pioneer Park that will be upgraded include new lighting, recreation spaces and landscaping. The current drainage will also be upgraded to a 'living stream' allowing grass to be installed over the top. The bronze 'Horse at Work' sculpture pictured below will also be returned to the park in a new position once construction is completed, which is projected to be October 2022.



# CBD Project Update — Town Square & Apex Park

The detailed designs for both the Town Square and Apex Park are now in progress after a Tender was awarded in April. These designs will incorporate feedback from the community, and will also include a number of exciting upgrades including more play equipment!

Merredin Town Square will be transformed into a large outdoor event space and a space for the community to connect and tourists to explore. Apex Park will become a multi-generational play and recreation area for families and young people.

The construction tenders are expected to be advertised in November and awarded in January 2023. This will allow for construction of both Apex Park and Town Square to commence simultaneously in February 2023.

- Paper- Un-soiled, un-tied ne paper, magazines, telephone books etc. Cardboard- Un-solled flattened boxes
- and cartons etc. Aluminium & Steel- Cans, tins, clean foil, aerosol cans etc. Liquid paperboard- Milk, juice and laundry detergent

### What NOT to put in Recycling Bin

- Greenwaste (e.g. Grass clippings, garden cuttings inc. soil and leaves)/Organics/Food Scraps
- Styrofoam
- Electrical Goods
- Computers, Mobile Phones, e-waste Nan
- Steel Products other than steel cans
- (Recycle at landfill site) Food Soiled Pizza box
- Plastic Bags
- Clothes Cigarette Butts

Designated recycling areas have been provided at both the Chandler Road Landfill site and at certain locations around town sites. These areas are available to everyone. Council encourages everyone to use these areas in order assist in the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and extend the life of Council's landfill.
