

# **Council Adopts Corporate Business Plan**

The Shire of Merredin Council is excited to announce the adoption of the new Corporate Business Plan 2022/23 -2025/2026 (CBP) during the recent Ordinary Council Meeting held on Tuesday, 27 June 2023. This plan shows the steps the Shire will take towards achieving the vision Council and Community have set for the Shire of Merredin by describing our priorities, and the projects, initiatives and services the Shire will deliver over the next four years. It also outlines how these priorities will be funded and resourced, so the Community can easily see how the plan will be implemented.

Over the next four years, the Shire will embark on several significant projects that closely align with the key priorities highlighted in our Strategic Community Plan (SCP). These initiatives are thoughtfully detailed within the CBP, aiming to fulfill our promises to the community and make tangible progress towards their aspirations.

Our current areas of focus include a commitment to enhancing internal governance, strengthening financial sustainability, compliance, and meeting regulatory requirements. Simultaneously, we are dedicating efforts to review and plan for our recreation services and associated assets, ensuring they are optimised to meet the needs of our residents.

This plan also has a strong focus on the CBD Redevelopment Project. Building upon the successful completion of Pioneer Park in October 2022, featuring a new car park, recreation areas, and beautiful landscaping, our attention is now directed towards the construction of a vibrant Town Centre precinct and the revitalisation of Apex Park. The Shire of Merredin is seeking candidates with strong customer service experience and an interest in tourism and visitor servicing, to support our Visitor Centre team.

The successful applicant/s for the Tourism Officer role will have experience in the tourism industry (or similar) and able to provide quality and professional customer service in visitor servicing, Transwa bookings and Eastern Wheatbelt regional tourism, and to provide administrative support to the Visitor Centre Manager.

Ideally, candidates for the Tourism Support Officer role will have experience in the delivery of customer services in a similar environment, have knowledge of the local area and have a desire to share this with visitors to the region.

Both roles require the ability to work under pressure at times, particularly through the wildflower season, and to demonstrate they can work in a supportive team environment - a degree of flexibility on working days and hours is a must.

To ensure the successful candidates are able to take up their roles effectively, there will be 3 weeks full-time training. Casual work is available through the peak wildflower season, July-September 2023 and during this time, casuals will be required to support a 7-day rotational roster. Note: it is expected that there will be some ongoing employment for casual staff after October 2023, however this will be on an ad hoc basis.

# **E-Waste Recycling**

The Merredin Waste Management Facility is now accepting residential Electronic Waste (e-waste) – free of charge!

This aims to accommodate the State Governments ban on e-waste to landfill commencing in January 2024, and we will be accepting various e-waste types such as TVs, printers, computers, cables and kitchen appliances of all brands and models. Some items may not be accepted as reprocessing services are limited in the region, such as various medical electronic waste. # **CBD Redevelopment Update - Apex Park**

The Shire has recently submitted a Lotterywest grant application for the revitalisation of Apex Park. The additional funding sought from Lotterywest will support the Shire in completing the construction of the new park, funding play elements, soft-fall, park furniture and trees. The renewed space will provide a safe and inclusive space for people of all ages to play, exercise, and socialise.

The outcome of the Shire's application is anticipated to be received in October 2023.

# Synergy EV 'Fast' Charging Station

Synergy and Horizon Power are working with the State Government to create Australia's longest Electric Vehicle (EV) charging network (the WA EV Network).

Synergy recently completed the site set-out for the new transformer to be installed in Merredin as part of the EV Highway. It is anticipated that the new 'Fast' Charging Station will be installed by the end of the year.

Once completed, EV drivers will have access to 98 EV charging stations across 49 locations, from Eucla at the South Australian border to Kununurra in the far north of Western Australia.

# Merredin Recycled Water Network Upgrade

We are excited to announce that the Shire of Merredin has been successful in securing \$100,000 in grant funding from the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) through the Community Water Supply Program (CWSP) for the upgrade of its recycled water network.

This recycled water network is key to ensuring continued irrigation of the Shire's greenspaces. The upgrade of this network will improve the Shire's water security and operational efficiency, which will mean we will be able to maintain these greenspaces into the future.



## **Home Fire Safety**

As the weather continues to cool down and we start looking for more ways to warm up, we enter the higher risk time of year for fires in the home. A small fire can engulf a room in a couple of minutes, and your house can be beyond saving before the fire brigade arrives. Most home fires are preventable. Last month we discussed some tips around home fire safety – here are a few more!

#### Kitchen fires

- ▶ Never leave cooking unattended according to DFES, unattended heat sources are responsible for one in seven house fires. Keep flammable materials and loose fabric (like tea towels and curtains) away from the stove, keep your oven, range hood and grill free of built-up grease, and don't put anything metallic in the microwave.
- ▶ Putting water on a fat or oil fire is dangerous and will cause the fire to spread and potentially cause injury, a fire blanket should be used instead. Fire blankets are inexpensive and can be purchased from a number of retailers in Merredin. Keep one in your kitchen, and practice using it there are directions on the blanket housing, and easy demonstrations on Youtube.

#### **Electrical appliances**

- ▶ Only use licensed electrical contractors (Merredin has plenty of great ones!) to install or repair electrical components or appliances.
- ▶ Never leave electric blankets on while you sleep or leave the house and never store them folded.
- ▶ It can be very dangerous to overload or piggy-back power boards, extension leads or adapters. Ensure plenty of ventilation around power boards and adapters. We have a lot of old houses in Merredin, and the wiring can be quite old too if you have a lot of computers or other electrical devices in the house, have one of our local electricians check or upgrade your home's wiring.
- ► Always change the lint filter every time you put a load in the clothes dryer, and never overfill the dryer.
- ▶ If you see any visible damage to any electrical appliance or cable, have it inspected by an electrician or replace it.

# Fireplaces and chimneys

Make sure your fireplace meets approved standards and has been installed by a reputable tradesperson. Fires can start from a build-up of soot from previous winters, so it's definitely worth going to the effort to clean and maintain your fireplace and chimney each year. When putting more logs on the fire, take care that you haven't dislodged any embers — burning embers landing on carpet can very easily and quickly develop into a fire.

### Wildflower Season is here!

The Wildflower season for the Eastern Wheatbelt has officially begun, with the first sprouts of colour popping up in all of your favourite wildflower spots!

Over 980 species have been recorded in the Shire of Merredin alone. Species of acacia and eucalypt make up the majority, but also included are 47 species of orchids and numerous species of hakea, grevillea, verticordia and other varieties of heath land plants.

In the Merredin townsite, reserves such as Tamma Parkland and Merredin Peak are worth exploring, while it is also worth visiting Caw Street and Totadgin Conservation Park.
