LOTTERYWEST CONTRIBUTION TO NORTH **MERREDIN PRIMARY SCHOOL SITE**

On the 10 August 2018 the Hon Darren West presented the Shire of Merredin with a certificate for funding towards Stage Two of the North Merredin Redevelopment Project. As reported in our July Newsletter, the Shire was fortunate to receive funding to the value of \$186,186 from Lotterywest.

The presentation of the certificate was a small affair with attendance by Merredin Playgroup, Merredin Wildflower Society, Collgar Windfarm, Kath Brown representing Mia Davies Office and Shire Councillors and Staff.

The Shire wishes to extend its gratitude to the many community organisations that provided letters of support towards Stage Two to undertake this significant project. The project will see the site be transformed into a valuable community hub and allow the cross generation collaboration of many community groups.

ARE YOU BUSHFIRE READY?

As per the Bushfires Act 1954, there are certain duties required by property owners to be undertaken every year in order to ensure that your property is not a significant fire hazard. Whether you live on the property or it is a vacant block or a rural property, these duties must be carried out by 1 November each year (or within 14 days of becoming the new owner/occupier) and maintained until 16 March the following year.

With spring in full swing, September is the perfect time of year to spray and/or undertake slashing of excess grass on your property. Pruning back overgrown trees is also a vital task that should be undertaken to make sure your property is bushfire ready.

Failure to carry out your respective duties will result in the issuing of a notice by a relevant authorised officer. Where the owner/occupier fails to carry out the tasks delegated in the notice in the nominated time period, the Shire may enter upon the land and carry out the requisitions of the notice which have not been complied with . Pursuant to Section 33(5) of the Bushfires Act 1954, the amount of any costs and expenses incurred may be recovered from you as the owner/occupier of the land. Please ensure to have your relevant responsibilities attended to by 1 November 2018. It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to ensure your property is not a significant fire hazard which would not only pose a risk to your neighbours but ultimately to yourself and your family in the event of a bushfire emergency.

A list of your responsibilities as a property owner can be found in your Fire Break Order which was enclosed with your 2018/19 Rates Notice (see right). Misplaced your copy? You can download one from the main page of the Shire's website.


