## Wool Bale Planter Boxes

Have you noticed the new planter boxes lining the main street of Merredin? The planter boxes were installed on the median strip along Barrack Street and are part of a CBD beautification project. They were constructed by the team from Merredin Men’s Shed and are designed to replicate wool bales. The significance of the wool bales is in recognition of sheep farming, one of the primary industries that played a vital role in Merredin’s past, and its present and future. As a tribute to our local farming families, each wool bale planter box is marked with their very own wool brand and type. Stage 2 of this project will see the histories of these families displayed throughout the town.

The planter boxes were installed on 17th and 18th August with a colourful array of pansies planted in each one thanks to the dedicated locals growing and nurturing the flowers.

## Vietnam Veterans Day

Approximately 40 members of the community attended the Vietnam Veterans Day Service that was held at the Reflection Pond at Roy Little Park on 18 August 2016.

Vietnam Veterans Day is held on 18 August each year to remember the Australian and New Zealand soldiers who served our nation in the Vietnam War, in particular the Battle of Long Tan in 1966. The day was known as Long Tan Day, which was later adopted by Veterans as Vietnam Veterans Day. 2016 marks the 50th anniversary of the Battle of Long Tan.

The Merredin Army Cadet Unit initiated the Service, forming an honour guard for our Returned Servicemen, followed by the raising of the flags. Shire of Merredin



Councillor Mal Willis led the service and spoke of the Battle of Long Tan, honouring those who served, as well as acknowledging the people who were affected by the war, during and long after the day had passed.

All attendees were invited to the Merredin Military Museum for a sun downer following the service.

## Water Corporation to Remove Piping

The Water Corporation have advised us of a statewide project to remove and dispose of surplus asbestos/bituminous coated pipes from various locations throughout Western Australia. The removal of these pipes is scheduled to commence in September 2016 and will be carried out by contractor, Golder Associates. The removed piping will be

wrapped and transported to a dedicated facility in Perth. Water Corporation have assured that the project will be conducted in a safe and precautionary manner and the area will be cleared and treated to ensure there is no asbestos or other hazardous materials left at each site. ## Merredin Pool Waterwise Recognition

Merredin District Olympic Pool was one of 11 centres across the State recognised as Waterwise by the Water Corporation and the Leisure Institute of Western Australia (LIWA) at the LIWA State Conference on Monday 15 August. Water Minister Mia Davies congratulated the Shire of Merredin, which manages the pool, for its water saving efforts.

“The management of the Merredin District Olympic Pool has made an outstanding commitment to water efficiency by carrying out an extensive review of how they use water and developed a plan to achieve ongoing water saving,” Ms Davies said.

To be endorsed as waterwise, an aquatic centre must demonstrate a number of water saving measures. These include reading water meters daily, reporting and repairing any leaks detected, displaying water saving information for

patrons, installing minimum rates water-efficient fixtures and fitting, as well as minimising water use for operations such as backwashing and irrigation.

In addition to the minimum water saving measures, the Merredin District Olympic Pool conducted an irrigation distribution test to reduce the amount of water used in the landscaping, and optimised usage of their automatic vacuum cleaner to reduce backwashing frequency.

“I encourage aquatic centres across WA to become involved in the free Waterwise Aquatic Centre Program to demonstrate their commitment to conserving water where they can,” the Minister said.

The corporation has worked with LIWA to promote water efficiency in aquatic centres, which has helped the industry save more than 700 million litres since 2008 - which, in aquatic centre terms, is about 280 Olympic-sizes pools.

## Declared Pest Rate to be Introduced

Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group (EWBG) has been assisting Wheatbelt sheep farmers manage wild dog populations and reducing stock losses for over 10 years. Kulin farmer and founder of EWBG, Jim Sullivan, reports that with the control of wild dog populations stock losses have declined from over 1000 in 2008 down to 50 last year. Additionally, the group has noticed that with the removal of wild dogs (as well as cats and foxes) native fauna such as kangaroos, native marsupials and birds have returned to treated areas.

Previously, the EWBG wild dog control program was funded

by 50:50 contributions from the State Government and local shires. From September 2016 a rate on landholdings of 20ha and above will be introduced to assist the funding of the wild dog control program with contributions matched by the State Government.

EWBG are encouraging the community to learn more about the program and provide the opportunity to ask questions about the introduced declared pest rate. The next annual general meeting of Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group will be held in Merredin on 23 September in the DAFWA conference room and members of the community are welcome to attend. ## Wildflowers are Blooming

Did you know that the Wheatbelt is a hotspot for wildflowers? Merredin welcomes tourists from all over Australia to witness its diversity in wildflowers.

August to October is the best time to see wildflowers in bloom. Take a stroll through our local reserves and you will be able to see the bright yellow Acacia and rich red Grevillea and Hakea. Look closer and you may spot delicate orchids like Spider Orchids, Donkey Orchids and Inland Hairy Stem Orchids (Snail Orchids). Pink Everlastings are in full bloom blanketing the bush with bright pink.

There are several reserves around Merredin with wildflowers in bloom; Merredin Peak Reserve is on Benson Road (near the Barrack Street industrial area) and Tamma Parkland is on South Avenue. Just a short drive out of town



will bring you to Totadgin Conservation Park (Bruce Rock-Merredin Road).

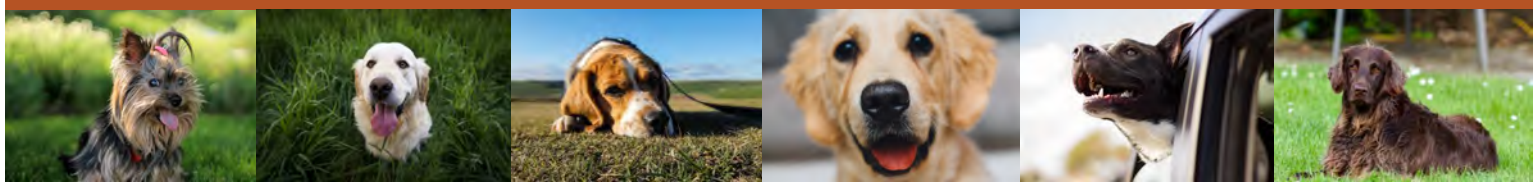
